

# COMMENTS TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY AGENDA

Item 2: Every FIAV Member is **strongly** encouraged to appoint a delegate and alternate to represent it in Yokohama. If no person from a FIAV Member is able to come to Yokohama, that FIAV Member is **strongly** encouraged to appoint as its delegate either the delegate of another FIAV Member or one of the three FIAV Officers.

Credentials should be brought to Yokohama. If at all possible, credentials should be on the Member's official stationery.

The suggested form of written credentials is as follows:

To the President of the Fédération internationale des associations vexillologiques:

[Name of FIAV Member association or institution] appoints [name of person (and alternate, if desired)], as its delegate to the Twenty-First Session of the FIAV General Assembly, to be convened July 14, 2009, in Yokohama, Japan.

[Delegate's name] has full powers to act on behalf of [name of FIAV Member association or institution] during the Twenty-First Session of the General Assembly [or] The powers of [delegate's name] to act on behalf of [name of FIAV Member association or institution] during the Twenty-First Session of the General Assembly are limited as follows: [describe].

Item 6: The Board will present both oral and written reports in Yokohama.

Item 7: The Board has received a proposal from NVvV, SVN, and SVPR to organize ICV 25 (2013) in Rotterdam, The Netherlands from August 4 to 10 and proposals from FSA to organize ICV 26 (2013) in Sydney, Australia in late August to early September and from SAVA to organize ICV 26 (2013) in Sandton (near Johannesburg), South Africa. The President, Michel R. Lupant, Secretary-General, Charles A. Spain, Jr., and Secretary-General for Congresses, Graham Bartram, announce their intention to stand for re-election.

Item 9: The Board has summarized SVN's membership application as it relates to the criteria set out in article 7(c) of the FIAV Constitution as follows:

The Board recommends the admission of SVN. The Secretary-General has attempted, unsuccessfully, to contact NZFIT in order to update the summary of NZFIT's membership application (see *Info-FIAV* number 21, page 3, 2005). Because the Board has been unable to contact NZFIT and it appears no representative will be present in Yokohama, the Board makes no recommendation on NZFIT's admission.

Item 10: The Board recommends the selection of NVvV, SVN, and SVPR as the ICV 25 (2013) organizers.

Item 11: The Board takes no position on the selection of the ICV 26 (2015) organizer.

Item 12: The Board recommends the approval of HGZD's resolution to amend the FIAV Constitution to define a failure to send a delegate to three consecutive General Assembly sessions as a voluntary resignation from FIAV. Adoption of this resolution would establish a noncontroversial method to terminate the membership of associations and institutions that are defunct or no longer interested in participating in FIAV.

Item 13: The Board recommends the approval of ASV's proposed medals, ribbons, and lapel pins for Laureates of the Federation and Fellows of the Federation. It is a common practice for learned organizations to recognize individuals with such awards. If the proposed medals, ribbons, and lapel pins are adopted, then the Board will find a way to manufacture those items at no cost to FIAV.

Item 14: The Board continues to believes FIAV should do whatever is necessary to ensure that the proceedings of all International Congresses of Vexillology are published. Fortunately, there has been significant progress made on this issue in the past two years.
